El Ministro de Comercio de Gibraltar es invitado a la Conferencia Latinoamericana de Bitcoin y Blockchain en Santiago de Chile

La visita a Chile conllevará la participación del Ministro Ísola en una mesa redonda sobre regulación y captación de empresas de blockchain.

Gibraltar, 5 de diciembre de 2018

El Ministro de Comercio, Albert Ísola, ha sido invitado a participar hoy en una mesa redonda en el marco de la Conferencia Latinoamericana de Bitcoin y Blockchain (Latin American Bitcoin and Blockchain Conference, LABITCONF), que se celebra en el Centro Cultural CorpArtes de Santiago de Chile. La conferencia analizará durante tres días todos los aspectos de la comunidad de Registros Digitales Compartidos (DLT) y las estrategias específicas que pueden adoptar los países para atraer a las empresas de blockchain y regular el sector.

El Ministro de Comercio de Gibraltar, Albert Ísola, comentó: "LABITCONF ha cobrado una gran importancia como plataforma de debate de alto nivel centrada en el blockchain desde su creación en 2013 y es la conferencia de Blockchain/DLT más importante de Latinoamérica. Estoy deseando participar en una mesa redonda dinámica sobre las estrategias que los países pueden adoptar no solo para atraer empresas de blockchain, sino para incorporar regulación sostenible a sus jurisdicciones".

LABITCONF, que se celebra anualmente desde 2013, reúne a algunas de las mentes más brillantes del mundo y a ponentes de primer nivel pertenecientes al sector, facilitando la colaboración y el debate entre una amplia variedad de actores destacados de la industria de más de veinte países que exploran todo el potencial de la tecnología blockchain. El Ministro Ísola estará acompañado en la mesa redonda por Joey García, Socio de Servicios Financieros para Blockchain/Fintech en ISOLAS LLP; Jacob Farber, Socio de Ouroboros LLP Blockchain Law & Strategic Consulting; Pablo Coirolo, Fundador de CryptoBay Montevideo; y Juan Llanos, Fundador de Multiple Startups y Asesor de Cumplimiento para Blockchain.

Durante la conferencia, el Ministro Ísola también se reunirá con diversos representantes de empresas de Gibraltar con sede en Sudamérica. Para el Gobierno de Gibraltar, este acontecimiento supone la visita de sus funcionarios a Sudamérica para asuntos relacionados exclusivamente con la tecnología blockchain. Anteriormente, este año, el Ministro Ísola había participado en diversas conferencias y eventos internacionales de alto nivel centrados en el análisis de la tecnología blockchain, incluyendo la DC Fintech Week, celebrada en noviembre en Washington, y el Día de Gibraltar en Tel Aviv, celebrado en octubre, evidenciando las credenciales de Gibraltar como jurisdicción destacada en materia de blockchain con alcance global.

"A medida que el ecosistema general de blockchain sigue evolucionando con rapidez, la importancia de la regulación nunca ha sido tan acuciante. Tras un año muy ilusionante, en el

que Gibraltar ha introducido con éxito un marco legislativo para Registros Digitales Compartidos (DLT) y, posteriormente, ha concedido licencias DLT a diversas empresas, estoy deseando exponer mi punto de vista sobre cuál es la mejor manera de conformar un marco regulatorio sostenible junto con mis estimados ponentes”, concluyó el Ministro Ísola.

Gibraltar's Minister for Commerce Invited to Latin American Bitcoin and Blockchain Conference in Santiago

Visit to Chile will see Minister Isola participate in panel discussion on regulating and attracting blockchain firms

Gibraltar - December XX, 2018 - Gibraltar's Minister for Commerce, The Hon Albert Isola MP, has been invited to participate in a panel discussion on Wednesday, 5th December, at the Latin American Bitcoin and Blockchain Conference (LABITCONF) taking place in Centro Cultural CorpArtes, Santiago, Chile. The 3 day conference will explore all aspects of the DLT community and specifically strategies that countries can adopt to attract blockchain companies and regulate the industry.

Gibraltar's Minister for Commerce, The Hon Albert Isola MP, said, "LABITCONF has built strong momentum as a platform for high level blockchain debate since its inception in 2013 and is the major DLT Blockchain conference in Latin America. I look forward to taking part in a dynamic panel discussion on the strategies countries can adopt to not only attract blockchain companies, but bring sustainable regulation to their jurisdictions."

LABITCONF, held annually since 2013, brings together some of the world's brightest minds and top speakers within the space, facilitating collaboration and discussion between a wide variety of leading industry players from more than 20 countries, exploring the full potential of blockchain technology. Minister Isola will be joined on the panel by Joey García, Fintech/Blockchain Financial Services Partner at ISOLAS LLP; Jacob Farber, Partner at Ouroboros LLP Blockchain Law & Strategic Consulting; Pablo Coirolo, Founder of CryptoBay Montevideo; and Juan Llanos, Founder at Multiple Startups and Blockchain Compliance Advisor.

During the conference, Minister Isola will also meet with a number of representatives of Gibraltar firms based in South America. For HM Government of Gibraltar, this represents the first time officials have visited South America exclusively for blockchain focused business. Already this year, Minister Isola has appeared at a number of high profile international conferences and events geared towards blockchain exploration including November's DC Fintech Week in Washington, as well as Gibraltar Day in Tel Aviv in October, underlining Gibraltar's credentials as a leading blockchain jurisdiction with global reach.



"As the wider blockchain ecosystem continues to evolve at a fast pace, the importance of regulation has never been more pronounced. Following a very exciting year, in which Gibraltar successfully introduced a purpose-built legislative Distributed Ledger Technology (DLT) framework and subsequently granted DLT licences to a number of firms, I look forward to outlining my perspective on how to best shape a sustainable regulatory framework alongside my esteemed panelists," concluded Minister Isola.
